Eden's Epistle

Exciting things are happening at Airport Marina Counseling Service (AMCS)! Below is some information on current happenings at the clinic:

We are currently interviewing for our September 2017 cohort of Marriage and Family Therapy trainees/interns. Anyone interested in applying is encouraged to send a cover letter, resume and application to our Training Coordinator, Mr. Bob Northcutt, LMFT at bnorthcutt@airportmarina.org. The AMCS training application may be found on our website.

The clinic is reevaluating its intake process. We are looking at adding regular standing times when clients can call to start the intake process and having the same therapist, that does the intake, see the client for therapy. The goal is for potential clients to have a seamless experience from the time they first contact AMCS.

AMCS is expanding its programming and is developing a LGBTQI (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, questioning, and intersex) Track. The goal is for our therapists to

develop the knowledge and skill set to service this population with a greater understanding to be as effective in treatment as possible. AMCS has hired a supervisor that specializes in this field and the track will formally launch in September.

AMCS is teaming up with Maleman Ink to develop and implement a Marketing and Communications Strategy for the clinic. This strategy will help AMCS to raise its public image, enhance fundraising and more effectively brand AMCS. Stay tuned!



Meet a Member - Mireya Wharton

Mireya Wharton is one of our senior members of the Guild and still serves on the Board. She is 96 years young and was awarded the Heart of Gold in 2002. Mireya remembers volunteering at AMCS doing office work before computers did everything. Mireya was born in Nicaragua, one of 6 children. Her father was a distinguished statesman in Nicaraguan politics. Her mother was a beautiful, resourceful woman who

raised the family during some turbulent times, including the Revolution of 1927. She met her husband, Ed, during World War II while he was working for the US Army Corps of Engineers and she was working in the American Library. She married the handsome *gringo* and they lived in Nicaragua, Chile and Mexico. In Mexico, Mireya founded a Montessori Kindergarten and taught Spanish. In 1954, they moved to the U.S. with their 3 young

children and settled in Westchester in 1955. Mireya worked for Western Airlines and enjoyed traveling around the world. Mireya has been active in many charitable endeavors including President of the AFS, Chapter President of the ACLU, Westchester Democratic Club, PEO and of course WMHG. 

Volunteer and Learn Our Community's History

Because we know that volunteer work is a path to better mental health, we want to alert our members about a local volunteer opportunity. Studies have demonstrated that volunteering improves the brain's biochemical activity by releasing endorphins, the *feel good* chemicals that help us combat stress.

There is a new local history center, called Westchester's **Jewel and Playa's Treasure**, that has been established in the Westchester Triangle, and needs volunteer docents. If you can spare two hours every other Sunday, you might be interested in helping to staff the new history room, which is intended to be open during the Sunday Westchester Farmers' Market. After receiving

training and a one-hour presentation on local history, volunteers will be expected to open or close the room, serve as hosts to create a welcoming atmosphere, answer general history questions, and act as stewards for the collection housed at the center. Volunteers do not need extensive knowledge about our community, but should have an interest in it. If that is you, please call 310-645-5151.

Whether it is packing boxes at a food pantry, answering questions at the local history center, or serving as a docent at the Guild's annual Holiday Home Tour (which, by the way, is Sunday, November 5 this year), helping others is a great way to make new friends and feel you are part of our community.



Guild Crafters Create Success

Many of the former **Guided Cage** volunteers have found a way to keep in touch with each other while at the same time benefiting the Guild. The group, calling themselves the **Guild Crafters**, meets about once a month to socialize and create items that can be sold at the Holiday Home Tour Marketplace, the Annual Meeting, other Guild meetings, or community craft fairs.
